<p>French sport and the Olympics</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Selection of P.E. equipment (item per table) - Laptops, computers, tablets (optional) - Devices for enabling the children to record their voices (optional) - Bilingual dictionaries (optional) - Dice and counters – one dice between two children and a counter for each child - A large space like a hall, gym or playground area - 1-3 sets of plastic boules* <p>*If you cannot get hold of boules, you could improvise using different kinds of balls but you will need to explain to the children that what you are using are not the correct boules (remind the children that it is good to be able to improvise and adapt a game where necessary). You could even play a miniature version of pétanque using marbles.</p>
<p>French football champions</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Pens and paper - A whistle - A ball or beanbag - Teacher Support: Translation French footballer text (see Resources) – for the teacher - Laptops, computers or tablets

<p>Life in my home</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bilingual dictionaries - Whiteboards or paper - Scissors - Some classroom objects that the children can name in French such as a pencil, a toy and a book - Glue - A toy - A box, large enough for the toy to fit inside
<p>The holidays! En vacances!</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Atlases - Writing frame - A suitcase with a selection of summer holiday clothing inside - Bilingual dictionaries if available - Laptops or computers
<p>My town and places: En ville</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bilingual French/English dictionaries - Scissors - A map showing roads and places, either outside in the playground using chalk or in the classroom using masking tape - <i>Aller à l'école</i> picture resources from Lesson 1 (optional) - Something to use as a stamp for passport control - Mini whiteboards and pens, per group of pupils - Your local tourism website
