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Introduction

As children navigate an increasingly digital landscape, technology offers significant potential for learning, creativity and connection. However, it also presents challenges that can impact their wellbeing, identity and relationships. Consequently, effective online safety education must move beyond a simple list of rules; it needs to equip pupils with the necessary knowledge, skills and behaviors to engage with the online world responsibly, safely, respectfully and confidently.

Kapow Primary integrates online safety primarily through RSE & PSHE and Computing, with each subject providing a distinct yet complementary perspective:

- **RSE and PSHE:** Concentrates on the social and emotional dimensions of online life. Key topics include online relationships, respectful communication, consent, boundaries, digital wellbeing, self-image, identifying unsafe situations and knowing how to seek help.
- **Computing:** Focuses on the technical and practical elements of using technology securely. Key topics include privacy, data security, password management, evaluating digital content, conducting safe searches and understanding the mechanics of digital systems.

By addressing certain areas across both subjects, learning is reinforced in different contexts, helping pupils develop a more secure, practical and comprehensive understanding of online safety.

About Education for a Connected World

[Education for a Connected World](#) is a non-statutory framework published by the UK Council for Internet Safety. It describes the digital knowledge, understanding and skills that children and young people should have opportunities to develop at different ages and stages. It is organised into the following eight areas:

- Self-image and identity.
- Online relationships.
- Online reputation.
- Online bullying.
- Managing online information.
- Health, wellbeing and lifestyle.
- Privacy and security.
- Copyright and ownership.

The framework provides a structure for developing and reviewing online safety education across the curriculum. Kapow Primary has used it alongside the statutory guidance for [Relationships Education, RSE and Health Education](#) and the DfE's non-statutory [Teaching online safety in schools](#) guidance. The latter explains how schools can teach pupils to stay safe and behave appropriately online through existing curriculum subjects, including Relationships Education, Health Education and Computing.

Kapow Primary has incorporated the knowledge and skills identified in [Education for a Connected World](#) across its RSE & PSHE and Computing schemes. This document shows where each framework statement is covered, helping schools to understand how online safety education is addressed across the two subjects.

Careful consideration has been given to where each statement is most relevant within the curriculum and to children's lives. As a result, some statements placed within a younger age band in the framework are covered later in the Kapow Primary curriculum, while some statements placed within an older age band are introduced earlier. This creates an age-appropriate sequence in which learning is introduced in a meaningful context and revisited where appropriate.
