

¿Tienes hermanos? - Do you have any brothers or sisters?



Tengo dos hermanas.

I have two sisters.



Tengo un hermano y una hermana.

I have one brother and one sister.



Soy hijo único/ hija única.

I am an only child.

Subject pronouns are not used often in Spanish so the verb endings are important for telling you who the sentence is about.

First person singular	I	yo
Second person singular	You	tu
Third person singular	He/she/ they	el/ella/ elle



In Spanish, the verb endings change according to who is doing the action.

yo - I	tu - you	el/ella/elle - he/she/they
me llamo - I am called	te llamas - you are called	se llama – he/she is called
tengo - I have	tienes - you have	tiene – he/she has
vivo - I live	vives - you live	vive- he/she lives

In Spanish we do not say, 'my mother's father', but instead we say: El padre de mi madre - the father of my mother.
