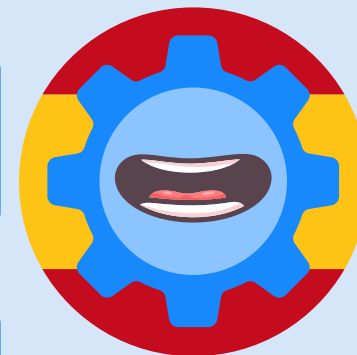
In Spanish, the colour adjective is placed after the noun it describes, so we literally say 'a circle blue' - **un círculo azul**.
