

# R&W - KS2: Why and how is Easter celebrated?

## LKS2

<b>crucified*</b>	Being killed by being nailed or tied to a cross.
<b>Easter*</b>	A Christian festival celebrating the life, death and resurrection of Jesus.
<b>forgiveness*</b>	Letting go of angry or hurt feelings and giving someone another chance.
<b>New Testament*</b>	Part of the Christian Bible that include the stories about Jesus and his teachings.
<b>resurrection*</b>	The action of coming back to life.
<b>sin*</b>	An action or behaviour which is believed to break the laws given by God or a Higher Power.
<b>traditions*</b>	Ways of doing things that have been passed down through generations.

## UKS2

<b>ascension</b>	The event in which Christians believe Jesus rose into heaven.
<b>crucifixion</b>	Killing someone by nailing or tying them to a cross.
<b>interpretation*</b>	An explanation or understanding of what something means.
<b>Orthodox*</b>	Following traditional beliefs, practices, rules and customs.



### Palm Sunday



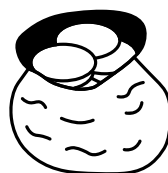
Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey and was greeted with excitement and palm leaves waved in the air.

### Maundy Thursday / The Last Supper



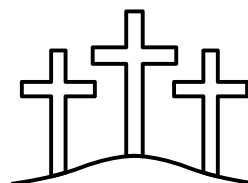
Jesus and his disciples enjoyed a Passover meal together. Jesus shared bread and wine and told how it represented his body and blood.

### Betrayal



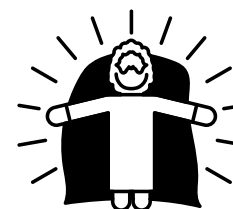
As Jesus predicted, one of his disciples, Judas, told Roman leaders about him. This led to Jesus' arrest.

### Good Friday



Jesus was crucified and died on the cross. His friends buried him in a tomb nearby.

### Easter Sunday



An angel told Jesus' friends that he had resurrected and was alive again.

### Ascension



After 40 days spending time with his disciples, Jesus returned to God.
