Palm Sunday




Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey and was greeted with excitement and palm leaves waved in the air. Maundy Thursday / The Last Supper

Jesus was crucified and died on the cross. His friends buried him in a tomb nearby.



An angel told Jesus' friends that he had resurrected and was alive again.
